The *Psychiatric Rehabilitation Journal* is a peer-reviewed interdisciplinary journal published quarterly by the Center for Psychiatric Rehabilitation, Sargent College of Health and Rehabilitation Sciences, Boston University, in collaboration with the US Psychiatric Rehabilitation Association (USPRA).

The *PRJ* is seeking submissions for articles (5,000 words) and brief reports (1,500 words) focused on the rehabilitation and recovery of people with serious mental illness. Articles may include, but are not limited to, qualitative and quantitative research studies on innovative program models and topics of employment, education, housing, recovery, health promotion, and system change. We welcome submissions from mental health and rehabilitation researchers and professionals, persons with psychiatric disabilities, and family members. We also welcome perspectives and personal accounts for the “Coping With” and “Speaking Out” sections which are limited to 1,200 words. Material is reviewed for publication on condition that it has not been previously published, including electronic publication, and is not being reviewed for publication elsewhere.

Submission Guidelines for Authors

Contributors to the *PRJ* should adhere to the Guidelines for Authors specified on the inside back cover of the journal or online at <http://www.bu.edu/cpr/prj/authors.html>. All manuscripts submitted to the *Psychiatric Rehabilitation Journal* should be submitted via Manuscript Central located at <http://mc.manuscriptcentral.com/prj>. Through this site, authors can submit articles and track the review progress up until acceptance for publication. Please disable “comments” and “track changes” in your documents prior to submitting a manuscript.

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All research manuscripts should include a structured abstract after the title page with the following information, under the headings:

- *Objective*: the primary purpose of the article;
- *Methods*: data sources, subjects, design, measurement, data analysis;
- *Results*: key findings; and
- *Conclusions and Implications for Practice*: implications, future directions.

Article abstracts should not exceed 250 words. Abstracts for brief reports should not exceed 150 words.

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All theoretical manuscripts should include a structured abstract after the title page with the following information, under the headings:

- *Topic*: in one sentence;
- *Purpose*: thesis or organizing construct and the scope of the article;
- *Sources Used*: personal observation, published literature, etc.; and
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Key Words and Biographical Information

Four (4) key words must be provided to be used for both the print and online versions of the journal. Limited biographical information should include the degrees, titles, and affiliations for each author in two to three lines of text.

APA (American Psychological Association) Style

All manuscripts and references must conform to the style set forth in the *Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association, 6th ed.* (<http://www.apastyle.org/>) also known as APA style. APA style is an editorial style that consists of rules or guidelines that the *Psychiatric Rehabilitation Journal* observes to ensure clear and consistent presentation of written material.
